# 1 Corinthians 1: 10-18

Now I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you be in agreement and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same purpose. For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there are quarrels among you, my brothers and sisters.

What I mean is that each of you says, “I belong to Paul,” or “I belong to Apollos,” or “I belong to Cephas,” or “I belong to Christ.” Has Christ been divided? Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. (I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.)

For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the Gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power. For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.

# Campus Redevelopment 2019 Milestones

- ▶ Phase 1 projects completed: Chapel, Youth/MPR with kitchen and ADA compliant restroom renovations
- ▶ Conditional Use Permit (CUP) completed with staff and neighborhood reviews and deemed complete for City Council
  - Phase 2 - upper parking lot, playground and walkways
  - Phase 3A - Parish Community Center ground floor
  - Phase 3B\*--Complete Parish Community Center second floor
  - Phase 4\*--Potential Preschool renovations to allow increased enrollment

- ▶ Sanctuary restrooms ADA compliance renovation
  - City of Poway approval to proceed with Sanctuary restroom renovation to create three single-accommodation ADA compliant restrooms
  - St Bart's is allowed discretion on timeline to proceed, independent of CUP approval
- ▶ St Bart's received \$100,000 grant for campus security upgrades
  - Parking lot lighting, cameras, electronic door locks, room to office campus-wide communications, emergency policies and procedures

# Honor Faith. Build Future. Campaign

- ▶ **2019** Annual Meeting recap
  - Funding raised: \$5.9M, cash received \$2.2M
  - Construction estimate 50% higher than \$8.0M campaign goal
  - Presented building phases to align redevelopment goals and \$8.0M budget
- ▶ **2020** Annual Meeting campaign update
  - Funding raised: \$6.83M, cash received \$3.385M
  - 60% pledge payments received THANK YOU!
  - Total expenses to date: \$985,630, available cash: \$2,399M
- ▶ Our path to reach our goal
  - Continue building relationships with one-on-one meetings
  - Preschool 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary invitation to support playground funding
  - Apply to relevant charitable foundations for potential funding

# St Bart's Strategic Plan

- ▶ Developed in 2015, rolled out in 2016
- ▶ Roadmap for parish ministries & prioritizes what we do
- ▶ Four main strategic plan pillars, 3 to 5-year goals under each
  - **Worship and Music**
  - **Christian Formation**
  - **Resource Management**
  - **Radical Hospitality and Outreach**
- ▶ Summer 2019 plan updated goals in each pillar

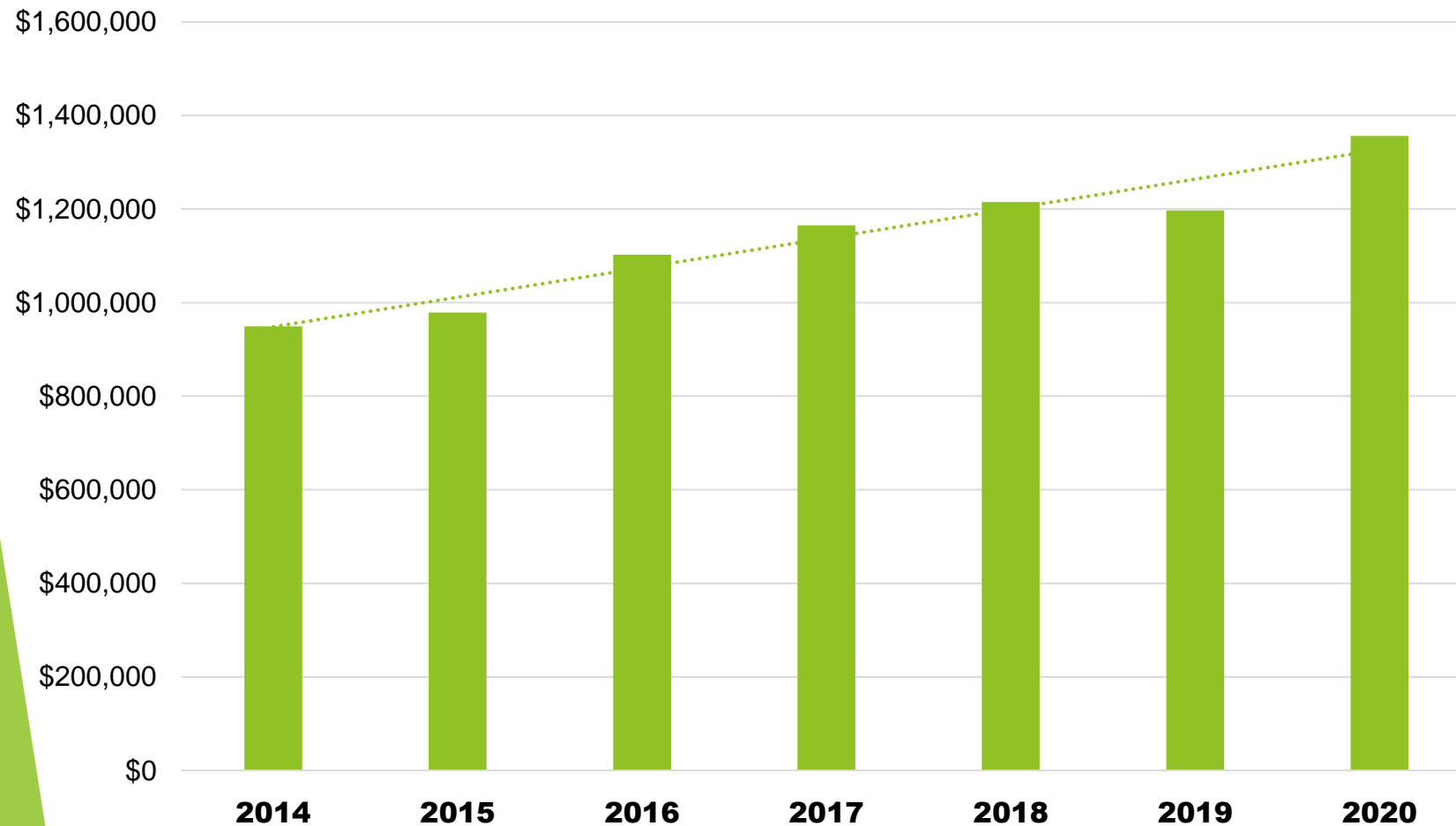

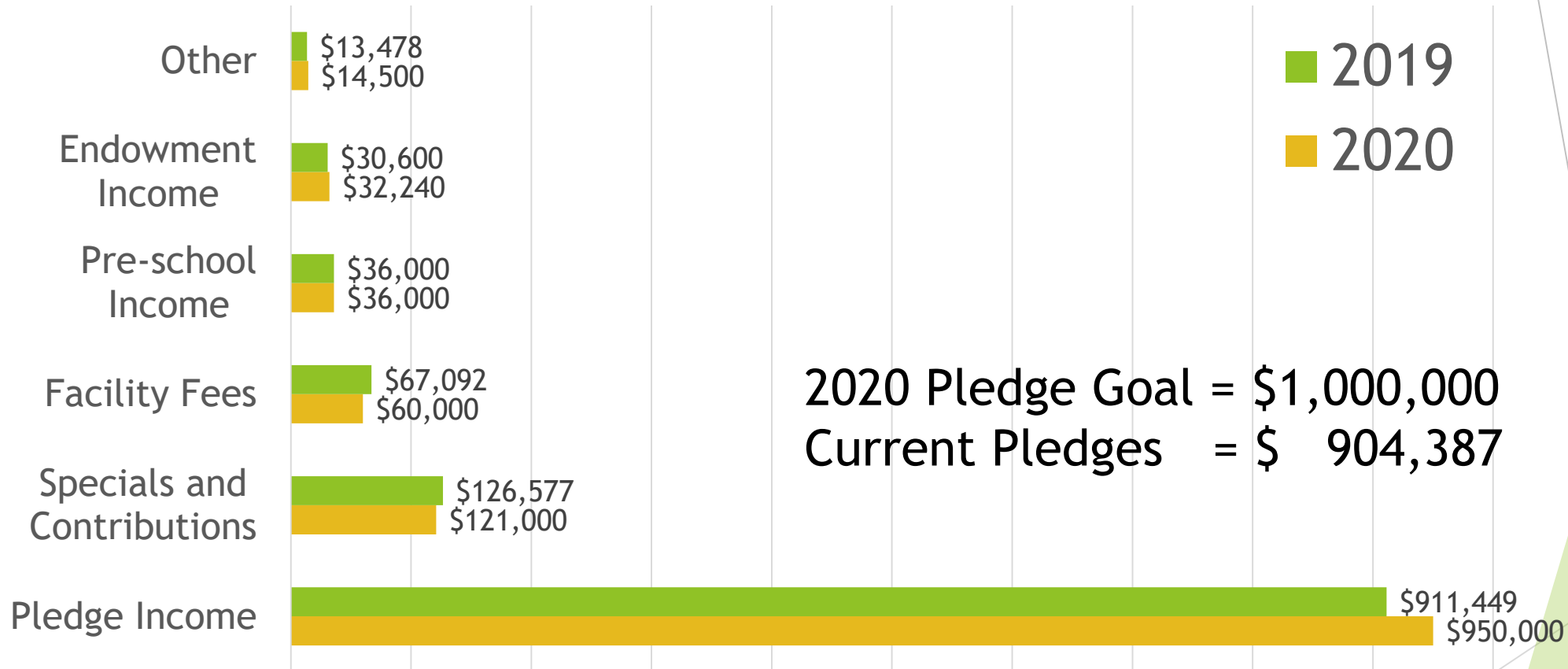

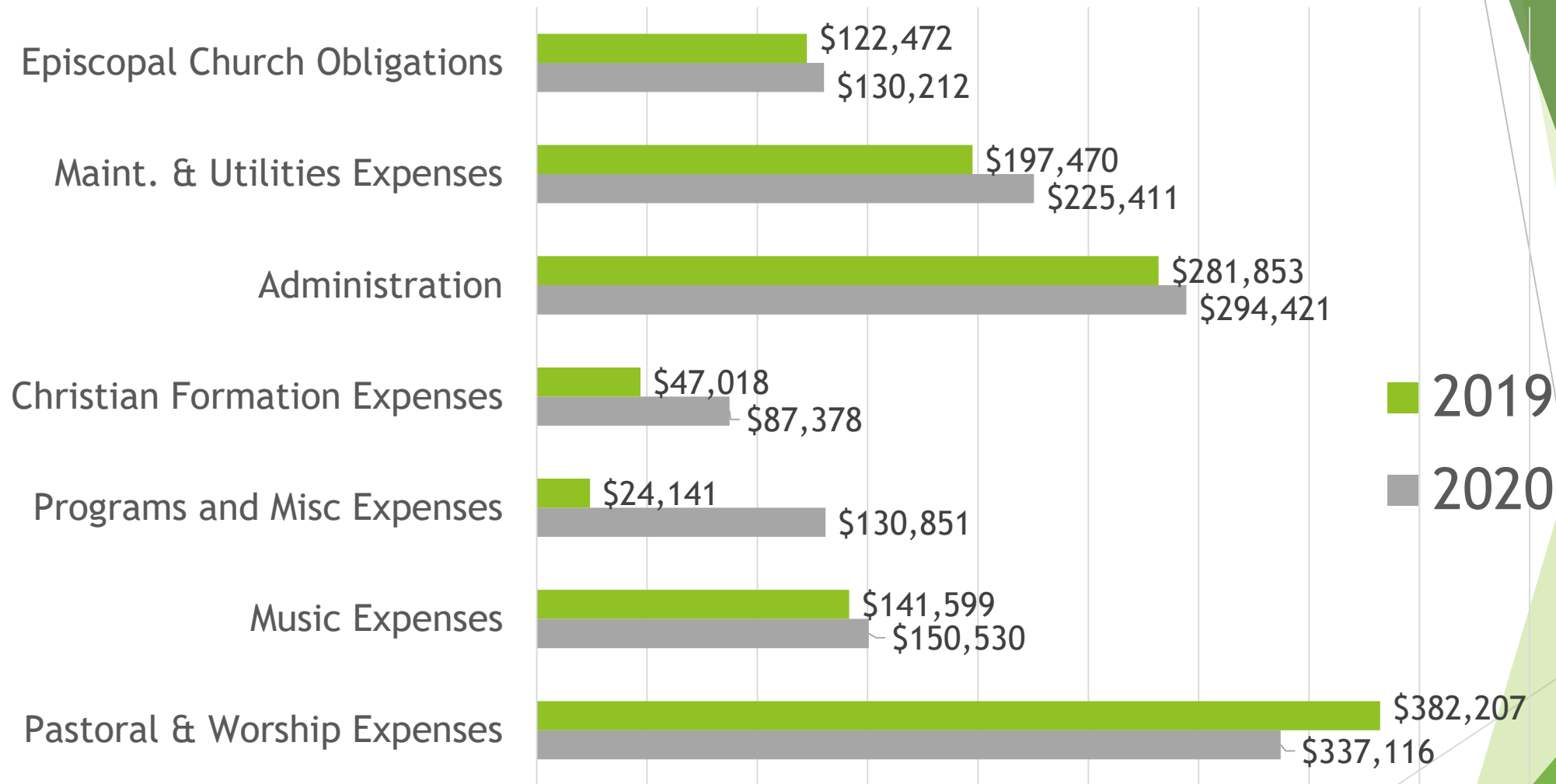

# City of Poway and Phase 2 Update

- ▶ St Bart's Conditional Use Permit (CUP) hearing was rescheduled by the City of Poway from January to March
- ▶ This new schedule to approve the CUP application delays timeline to complete work in Summer 2020, during Preschool recess
- ▶ Vestry approved postponing Phase 2 work until Summer 2021
- ▶ This new schedule for Phase 2 will not delay other components of our campus redevelopment projects

# Phase 2 Plan



- ▶ Remove Parish Hall
- ▶ Construct 50 space upper parking lot
- ▶ Build new accessible columbarium walkway
- ▶ Expand Preschool playground
- ▶ Build new walkway/stairs with lighting from lower parking to upper parking area



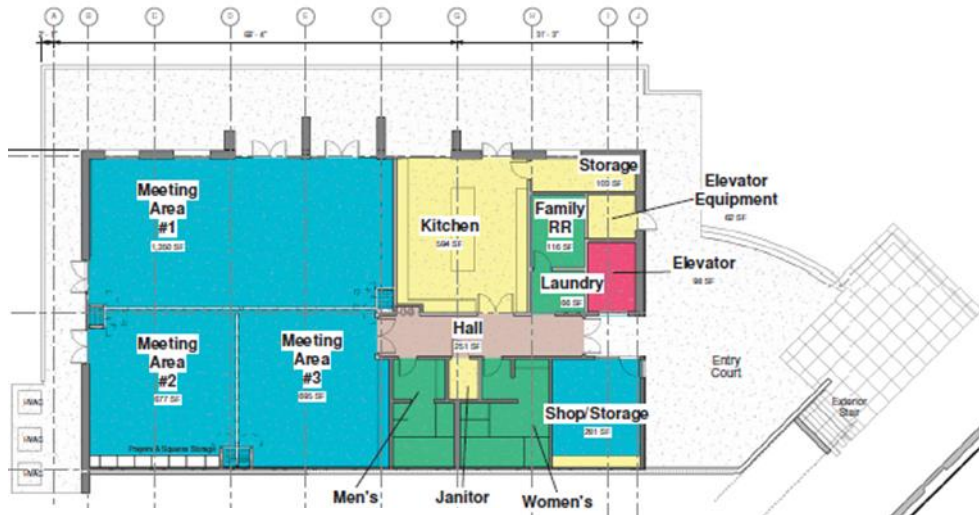
## 2020 Redevelopment Milestones

- ▶ Chapel furnishings built/purchased and installed (Feb 2020)
- ▶ Chapel stained glass installation (Feb 2020 installation)
- ▶ Youth/MPR furnishings continue to be added (Spring 2020)
- ▶ Remove unsafe diseased trees and replace with new trees (Spring-Summer 2020)
- ▶ Implement funded campus security improvements (2020-2021)
- ▶ Make decisions on proposed sanctuary modifications (Summer 2020)

# ST. BARTHOLOMEW'S BREAKS GROUND FOR NEW CHURCH

Groundbreaking ceremonies for the first units of St. Bartholomew's new Episcopal Church complex will take place Sunday.

Immediately following the 10 a.m. Eucharist at their present location, 14120 Midland Rd., the congregation will proceed to the new site, 16240 Avenida Florencia (off Pomerado Rd. near Rancho Bernardo.)

CALLAHAN Brothers of San Diego will begin construction immediately on plans drawn by Russell Forester, architect from La Jolla.

Episcopal services began officially in Poway under the direction of Episcopal Church Army Captain Raymond W. Lewis, acting for Dean Charles Under of the San Diego Con-cation. The first service of St. Bartholomew's was offered by a congregation of 12 on Feb. 5, 1960. The first permanent pastor was the Rev. J. Earl Kavanaugh, who assumed his duties in June of 1961. Fr. Kavanaugh became well-known

Poway residents as the spiritual leader of Rancho Bernardo Community Church until they were able to obtain their own pastor.

BISHOP Francis Eric Bloy appointed the Rev. James Watkins to the cure of St. Bartholomew's in September of 1964. Fr. Watkins was active in the Poway Jaycees and in La Jolla. After assuming a post in La Jolla, Fr. Watkins was succeeded by the Rev. J. Benjamin Thomas who served until September, 1967.

THE NEW vicar, the Rev. S. Hartimer Ward, assumed his duties in November. Fr. Ward

sees a bright future for St. Bartholomew's. The church has over 270 members on its rolls, and the projected growth of Poway and its surrounding area has made present church accommodations unsuitable. "Standing Room Only" signs are about to become common-

place at Family Services, due to the growing Sunday School and professional babysitting facilities.

GROUNDBREAKING for the new mission church is the result of years of planning and hard work, under the direction of Bishop's Warden David Shep-

herdson and Building Committee Chairman Dr. E. D. Woodhouse. Members from Poway and Rancho Bernardo have worked together on this project from the beginning, and the new church will become a symbol of the unity of the two communities.

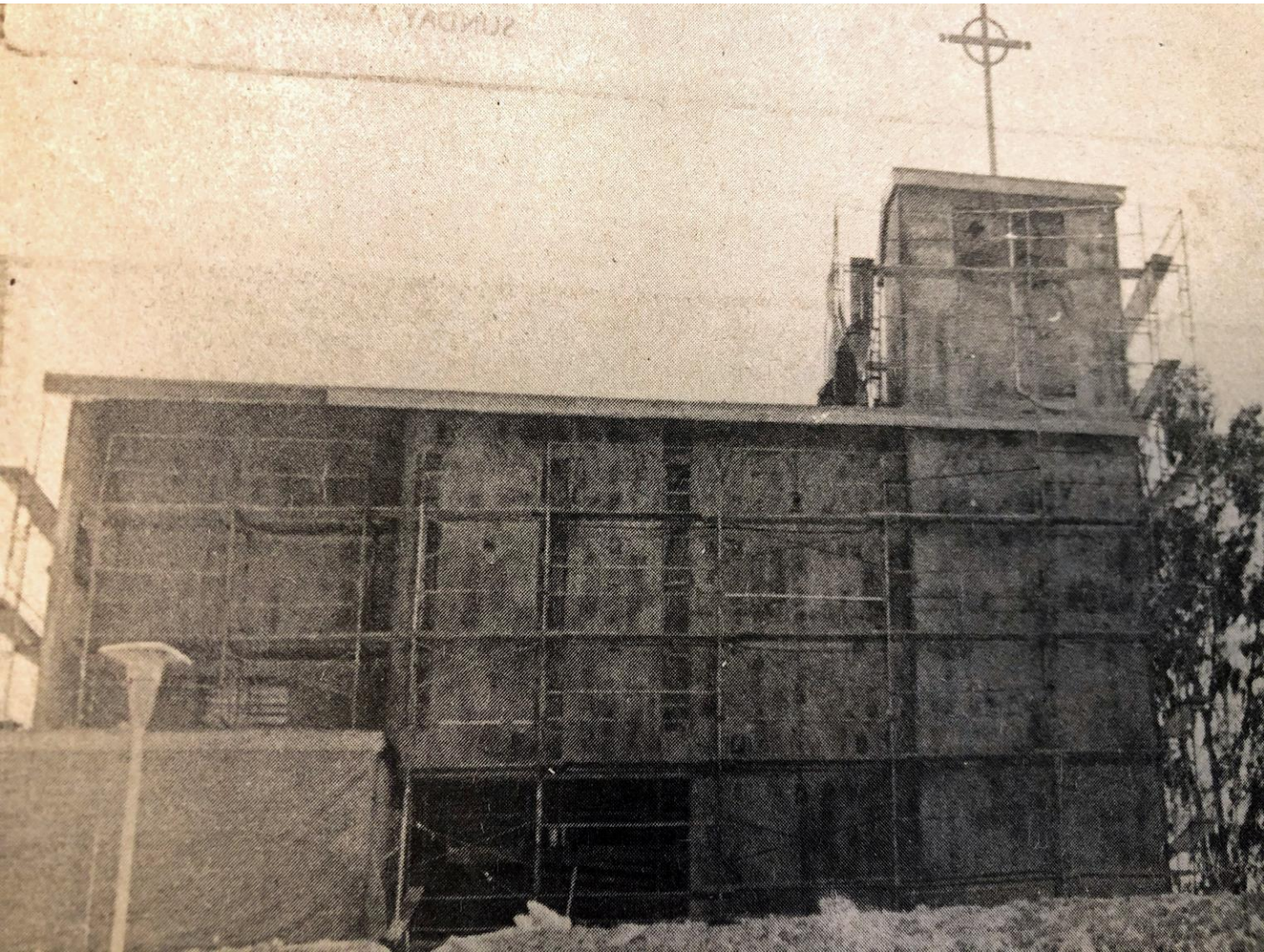
